

## **Information note 24/13 of the Commissariat aux Assurances on the possible organisation of an examination for future insurance agents and sub-brokers in the English language**

Dear Sir or Madam

Article 23 (3) of the *Commissariat aux Assurances Regulation No 19/01 of 26 February 2019 on insurance and reinsurance distribution, as amended*, (hereinafter the "**RCAA 19/01**") based on Article 288 (1) of the *Law of 7 December 2015 on the insurance sector, as amended* (hereinafter the "**LSA**"), limits the questions and proposed answers of the written examination for future agents and sub-brokers to the French language.

Despite this, a number of market players have asked the Commissariat aux Assurances (hereinafter the "**CAA**") whether it would be possible to organise an examination in English.

The CAA would, however, be open to organise a written examination in which the questions and answers would be formulated in English (hereinafter "**English examination**"). Although the terms of RCAA 19/01 provide for the written examination to be held in French only, it is common ground that, pursuant to article 288 (1), of the LSA, the CAA may grant exemptions. Successful completion of all the modules for which a candidate was registered for the English examination could therefore give rise to the granting of such an exemption.

Please note that there will be no additional oral examinations. Candidates for the English examination must therefore obtain:

- at least 60% of the points for each module for which they were registered, or
- an overall average of at least 60% of the points without having scored less than 50% of the points in any of the modules for which they were registered.

The English exam would be held once only, in parallel with the September 2025 session of the French-language written exam, i.e. on Thursday 25 September 2025

Therefore, in order to be able to assess the need to organise an English examination, the CAA invites insurance undertakings, insurance and reinsurance brokerage firms and individual brokers who have interested candidates to inform it by **31 January 2025** by email to [gouvernanceIDD@caa.lu](mailto:gouvernanceIDD@caa.lu) of

- the classes of insurance for which these candidates would be registered (life, non-life or life and non-life).
